'No Stone Left Alone' Brandon Ceremony

Media are invited to observe the Remembrance ceremony for *'No Stone Left Alone'* at the Brandon Veterans Cemetery. Approximately 750 students from École Harrison, St. Augustine School, and Valleyview School will place poppies at the gravesites of about 1200 veterans.

When: Monday, 6 November, 2017 – 10:00 – 10:45 a.m.

Where: Brandon Veterans Cemetery (1901 – 18 Street)

'No Stone Left Alone' is an initiative involving students who honour and recognize the sacrifices that Canadian military men and women made while serving Canada. In November, ***'No Stone Left Alone'*** ceremonies in British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Quebec, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, and Nova Scotia have students place a poppy on military headstones in Canadian fields of honour. This year, about 6,800 students from 85 schools across nine provinces will lay about 44,500 poppies on the graves of veterans in 104 cemeteries.
